RED BULL RING

The Red Bull Ring is 4,318 meters long and has ten corners.


The drivers drive only a short lap, but it is certainly not boring. In the first half of the track, the cars race along three straights, separated by a few uphill right turns. But then when the drivers go downhill, they have to race through a series of fast turns, including the Rindt turn, named after Austria's first F1 champion.

Beyond the racing excitement, the Red Bull Ring offers an immersive experience for fans. Its fan-friendly environment allows spectators to get up close to the action, offering multiple vantage points that promise spectacular views of the high-speed drama unfolding. The circuit's history, once known as the Österreichring, adds to its allure, blending a rich motorsport heritage with a modern racing spectacle, making the Red Bull Ring a revered and picturesque gem in the Formula 1 calendar.





LAST YEAR'S RACE



Max Verstappen secured his fifth consecutive victory in Austria with an outstanding performance, including an extra point for the fastest lap, further extending his lead over other drivers.

The Red Bull driver was once again dominant, leading Ferrari's Charles Leclerc and teammate Sergio Perez. The latter also had an impressive race, moving from P15 to the third spot on the podium.

McLaren's Lando Norris had much to celebrate at the Red Bull Ring, earning the Driver of the Day award for a stellar performance and clinching P4 after many drivers received additional time penalties post-race.

The entire race was marked by track limits, with numerous drivers initially penalized during the race. This led to the cancellation of a staggering 83 laps because drivers had exceeded track limits. Subsequently, twelve penalties were imposed on Carlos Sainz, Lewis Hamilton, Pierre Gasly, Alex Albon, Esteban Ocon, Logan Sargeant, Nyck de Vries, and Yuki Tsunoda.



How To Get There

Have you booked hotel nights + transfers with Race Experience? Then the transfers to the circuit might be included.

Apart from that, the easiest way is to get to the circuit by car. Parking is free and the <u>parking lots</u> are a 10-15 minute walk from the circuit.

Alternatively, public transportation is another option – travel to Knittelfield station. From there there are direct (free) shuttle buses to the circuit. Throughout the weekend a shuttle bus goes there every half hour from 08:00 to 20:00. From 20:00 to 23:00 it will be every hour instead of half hour. On Sunday, the shuttle buses only run until 19:00.

Opening Hours

The circuit opens its door at 07:00 in the morning the whole weekend.





Food and Drinks

The best selection of food and drink in Spielberg can be found in the Fan Zone. Normally you will find a selection of tasty Austrian food here; schnitzels, burgers and bratwurst are generally reasonably priced at about €6 and cheaper options are available.

In previous seasons, large beers (half-liter) were available for about €4.50. In addition, soft drinks and the like could be purchased for about €3. A cashless system in the form of a wristband is used at the track with which you pay. This can be upgraded with cash or a credit card.

You can also choose to bring food and drinks to the circuit. Please note that this may not be in glass containers or bottles. Also, you are not allowed to take your own alcohol onto the track.

Sanitary Facilities

In general, there are plenty of restrooms on the track. Pay attention to the signs directing you to the nearest restroom.

Walking Distance

Visiting a Grand Prix often involves a lot of walking. Be sure to wear comfortable shoes for all the walking required of you, and wear comfortable clothing.



Taking Pictures

Taking photos is allowed, but only with a simple camera. Attention will also be paid to obstructing the view of other spectators. The enjoyment of other spectators should not be interfered with by anyone, so we advise spectators to always pay attention to others.

Climate

The race takes place in late June, early July. During this period, daytime temperatures average 23°C. However, rain can certainly fall as well. So we recommend that you prepare for possible rain.

Recommended to take to the track

- ID proof and entrance ticket;
- Sun protection;
- Sturdy walking shoes;
- Hearing protection;
- Photo camera incl. extra battery and memory card;
- Your printed ticket.





Access Criteria

In case you are wondering whether something is allowed or not, please refer to the list below. All unauthorized items must be dropped off at the circuit entrance gates. Circuit staff have the right to add other items to the list.

- Dangerous items;
- Drugs;
- Alcoholic beverages;
- Harmful and flammable substances;
- Fireworks, smoke bombs, rockets, laser pointers, stadium horns;
- · Aerosol cans (deodorant, mosquito repellent, etc.).
- Bags or backpacks larger than 15 liters; Luggage and trolley;
- Cans, metal and glass bottles;
- Flagpoles and umbrellas;
- Vehicles (bicycles, scooters, etc.)
- (Domestic) animals;
- Mirror reflex cameras or video cameras;
- Tents and sleeping bags;
- Electronic cigars/cigarettes;
- Chairs and stools (folding chairs and stools are allowed).
