ACTIVITIES IN BUDAPEST


THE FISHING BASTION

MARKET HALL BUDAPEST

Situated in the Pest district, the Great Market Hall resembles an aged station, boasting a massive clock and stunning windows on its exterior. Recognized as Europe's most exquisite market and even hailed as the world's most beautiful market by CNN, it's a treasure trove of diverse offerings.

THE SYNAGOGUE

Budapest, the capital of Hungary, houses Europe's largest synagogue and the world's second-largest. Adjacent to this significant landmark is the Jewish Historical Museum, offering extensive insights into the city's Jewish history. Additionally, there's a memorial park nearby, dedicated to honoring victims of anti-Semitic violence.



THE PARLIAMENT OF BUDAPEST

When strolling along the Danube, this structure instantly captures your attention. Its striking exterior is matched by an equally remarkable interior. Due to a daily visitor limit, securing reservations is essential if you're keen on exploring the Parliament Building during your visit.



HEROES SQUARE

Heroes' Square stands as a renowned landmark and ranks among Budapest's most frequented squares. The focal point is the Millennium Monument, featuring a lofty column crowned by Archangel Gabriel, with the Seven Leaders of the Magyars positioned in front. This site holds UNESCO World Heritage status.



GET TO GELLÉRTBERG

At 235 meters tall, this summit claims the title of Budapest's highest point, towering above the capital's skyline. It offers a stunning vantage point to admire the panoramic beauty, providing views encompassing both Buda and Pest. Additionally, this hill holds UNESCO World Heritage recognition.







RESTAURANTS IN BUDAPEST



Italian, International | €€-€€€

The Oinos Bistrot is located close to the Impulso Fashion Hotel. A cozy and modern wine bar with an excellent selection of wines and good food. The menu has everything – tapas, pasta, pizza, salads, sandwiches and meat dishes. The staff is professional, hospitable and has extensive knowledge about the food and drinks. The prices are a bit on the high side by Hungarian standards, but according to the guests, they are more than worth it.



International | €

Café Csiga is a relatively small restaurant in the capital. The burger is highly recommended. You get a gigantic hamburger with fresh fries and a salad on the side. They also have choices such as soups, salads, meat dishes and vegetarian options. The locals also love to visit Café Csiga.



RESTAURANTS IN BUDAPEST



Hungarian, European | €€-€€€

Rosenstein is an iconic restaurant in Budapest. It was started by Tibor Rosenstein and is currently led by Róbert. A real family restaurant. Most of the menu is classic Hungarian dishes. Think of goulash soup, beef stew and stuffed cabbage rolls. Very popular is the foie gras with fried foie gras and potato croquettes soaked in tokaj sauce.



Hungarian, International | €€-€€€

Mazel Tov is perhaps one of the most beautiful restaurants in Budapest. It is located in the middle of a historic Jewish district. An old ruin has been transformed into a modern restaurant. The kitchen serves modern Jewish dishes and Hungarian wines. It is also highly recommended for those who love Middle Eastern cuisine. There is live music on weekends.
