ABOUT THE CIRCUIT

The Autodromo Internazionale Enzo e Dino Ferrari is a highly technical circuit with complex corners and a high tempo.

The circuit is 4.909 meters long and features 17 corners. The Italian circuit is one of the few with only one DRS zone. Imola is known for its succession of fast corners, especially the Tamburello, Villeneuve, and Tosa corners. These corners, combined with elevation changes on the circuit, demand a lot from the drivers and their cars. Drivers must find a perfect balance between speed and precision to maintain control and drive a good line.

Especially the Tamburello corner is known for multiple crashes - including the fatal crash of Ayrton Senna in 1994. Because Imola is raced counterclockwise, most corners are left turns.



HOW TO GET TO TRACK

The easiest way to get to the circuit is by **car**. From Bologna, it's about an hour's drive depending on traffic. Parking spaces cannot be reserved in advance, so the earlier you arrive, the greater the chance of finding a spot. Cash payment is required for parking at the entrance. In 2022, a day's parking cost approximately €10.

There are also plenty of **taxi** companies in the area that can take you to the circuit. Uber is also active there.

The **train** is also an option. The station is a 30-minute walk from the circuit. The journey from Bologna to Imola takes about 20 minutes and costs around €5 for a one-way ticket. You can easily purchase tickets through <u>this website</u>.



During the previous edition of the Emilia-Romagna Grand Prix, the circuit gates opened every day at 08:00. At this moment, the opening hours for 2024 have not been announced yet.

Please note that your bag will be checked at the circuit entrance.



There are three main entrances to the circuit.

- Ingresso Rivazzo: Best option for Grandstands Rivazza 1/2, Rivazza Lawn, Gresini 1/2/3/4, Acque Minerale 5, Start/Partenza 1/2/3/4
- Ingresso Tosa: Best option for Tosa 1/2, Tosa Lawn, Acque Minerale 5, Villeneuve 1/2/3/4
- Ingresso Dante: Best for General Admission, Paddock Club, Start/Partenza 1/2/3/4/5, Acque Minerale 1/2/3/4 and Villeneuve 1/2/3.





There are sufficient (temporary) toilets available on the circuit. Look out for signs directing you to the nearest toilet. In general, the toilets are kept very clean. The toilets can be very busy during a Grand Prix weekend, espeically right before a Formula 1 session.



In mid-May, Imola enjoys pleasant spring weather. The temperatures typically range between 18°C and 23°C, with occasional spikes reaching 25°C or higher. Rain is possible in May, with about a 30% chance. Typically, rain falls in the form of brief showers, allowing the sun to predominantly shine.



During a Grand Prix weekend, expect plenty of walking. Hence, opt for comfortable shoes and attire to avoid blisters and discomfort. Pick clothing that allows easy movement, ensuring you can fully enjoy the event.



It is allowed to take photos on the circuit with a simple camera for personal use. Pay attention to other spectators and avoid obstructing their view. Be respectful to fellow Formula 1 fans.







Throughout the entire circuit, various food and beverage stalls can be found. These include fast food options such as hamburgers and hotdogs, as well as Italian dishes like pasta and pizza. However, please be aware of long queues and relatively high prices. Bringing your own food or drinks is not allowed.



The F1 Fan Zone at the GP is located near the Main Grandstand. Here you will find interactive activities, merchandise stands and various food and drink stands. The Fan Zone is a vibrant hub where fans can enjoy entertainment and experience a sense of connection to the world of Formula One.



In addition to Formula 1, Formula 2, Formula 3, and the Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup will also be featured at the circuit. It marks the first race of the new season for the Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup.



The F1 app provides real-time updates on positions, times and pit stops and it enhances the racing experience with live audio and team radios. We recommend downloading the app on your phone for the best experience on the track.





If you are unsure about which items are allowed, you can consult the list below. Non-permissible items must be surrendered at the circuit entrance gates. Circuit staff reserve the right to add other items to the list. Your cooperation is appreciated to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all visitors.


