The Circuit Guide contains information for your trip to Las Vegas.

It provides essential information and insights for visitors attending a Grand Prix, offering details about the access points, food and drinks stand, prohibited items and more of the racing circuit.

LAS VEGAS STREET CIRCUIT

The Las Vegas Street Circuit, introduced in 2023, marks a thrilling addition to the racing calendar. Spanning 6,210 meters, the track boasts seventeen turns, featuring three straights and two DRS zones.

Drivers confront a variety of challenges, beginning with a sharp hairpin followed by left and right turns in the urban landscape. As racers navigate 800 meters along Koval Lane, they encounter a slow 90-degree right turn and a sweeping left turn around the MSG Sphere arena. Sands Avenue presents two fast turns before a slow left turn onto the iconic Las Vegas Boulevard, offering a 1,920meter straight for full-throttle action. Harmon Avenue leads to a series of sharp and slow bends, followed by an 800-meter straight and a fast left turn returning to the circuit's permanent section. The circuit's dynamic layout and strategic elements gives highspeed excitement and intense competition for drivers and spectators alike





CIRCUIT INFORMATION

Zones

Your ticket only gives you access to the zone in which your chosen stand is located. It is not possible to explore different areas of the Las Vegas Strip Circuit during the race weekend.

Transport

We suggest utilizing a rideshare service like Uber or Lyft to reach one of the designated locations nearest to your zone. Please note that they may apply an additional "F1 fee" on top of the standard fare, resulting in a higher total amount.

If your accommodation is in close proximity to the circuit, walking may be more convenient. Organizers highly recommend this option. Downloading the Las Vegas Grand Prix app will offer the quickest walking route to your designated zone.

There will be a number of road closures in Las Vegas. These start at 5:00 PM on each day of the race weekend (from Thursday to Saturday).





CIRCUIT INFORMATION

Food & Drinks

Your ticket includes food and non-alcoholic beverages. Wolfgang Puck Catering will handle all catering services at the circuit. In 2023, lines were typically short, and food was promptly served. Each item, such as hot dogs, hamburgers, and grilled cheese sandwiches, had its own booth. Staff continuously prepared food, ensuring quick service. Beer cost approximately \$10, while cocktails were priced around \$20.

Walking Distance

Attending a Grand Prix usually entails a considerable amount of walking. It is essential to wear comfortable shoes that can withstand the walking demands, along with comfortable clothing.

Taking Pictures

Photography is permitted; however, it is restricted to the use of simple cameras. It's important to be mindful of obstructing the view of fellow spectators. Everyone should ensure that their enjoyment does not disrupt others, so we encourage spectators to always be considerate of those around them.

Sanitary Facilities

Restrooms are located throughout the track. Pay attention to the signs directing you to the nearest restroom. At many Grand Prix circuits, the majority of toilets are temporary facilities set up specifically for the race weekend. While they are designed to meet sanitation standards and offer basic amenities, their temporary nature might mean variations in size, capacity, or comfort compared to permanent facilities.

Recommended to take with you to the circuit


- ID and entrance ticket;
- Sturdy walking shoes;
- Hearing protection;
- Photo camera incl. extra battery and memory card;
- Your printed ticket.

Entrance criteria for the circuit

If you are wondering whether or not something is allowed, please consult the list below. All unauthorized items must be surrendered at the circuit entrance gates. The circuit staff have the right to add other items to the list.

- Aerosols (deodorant, mosquito repellent, etc.)
- Alcoholic drinks and drugs
- Barbecues or (electric) cooking appliances
- Cans, metal and glass bottles
- Dangerous objects
- Drones
- Fireworks, smoke bombs, rockets, laser pointers, stadium horns
- Flagpoles and parasols
- Glass packaging and/or objects
- Harmful and flammable substances
- Pets
- Tents and sleeping bags
- Vehicles (bicycles, scooters, etc.)

Please note: you are not allowed to bring large, normal backpacks. Clear plastic bags must not exceed 12" x 6" x 12". Small bags or fanny packs must not exceed 4.5" x 6.5".
