

### AUTODROMO HERMANOS RODRIGUEZ

The Autódromo Hermanos Rodríguez, a revered venue on the Formula 1 calendar, is nestled in Mexico City, boasting a storied history and thrilling races. With its 17 turns and 4,438-meter length, the circuit challenges drivers with its high altitude, situated at 2,238 meters above sea level. The thin air tests the capabilities of Formula 1 engines, demanding precision and skill from drivers navigating its diverse sections.

One of its defining features is the extended straight, spanning over a kilometer, providing ample opportunities for overtaking. As drivers navigate technical corners and the challenging esses, they approach the iconic stadium section, notorious for its potential pitfalls. The circuit's ambiance, surrounded by enthusiastic fans, adds to the electrifying atmosphere, creating unforgettable moments in each race.

Autódromo Hermanos Rodríguez's significance extends beyond its track, embodying Mexico's passion for motorsports and hosting memorable Formula 1 events that captivate audiences worldwide.





### **CIRCUIT INFORMATION**

#### How To Get There

Accessing the Autodromo Hermanos Rodriguez by car is not feasible. The most convenient mode of transportation is via the metro, which anticipates heavy traffic due to high visitor volume. Trains depart frequently, offering flexibility for travelers; if one train is too crowded, simply await the next.

For those centrally located, a brief metro journey suffices. Board the brown line (line nine) heading towards Pantitlán, disembarking at the following stops:

- Velodrome: adjacent to Stadium Grandstands, Grada 14, and Grada 15.
- Ciudad Deportiva: convenient for the Main Grandstand.
- Puebla: ideal for Grandstands 3-6 and Grandstands 9-11.

#### **Opening Hours**

The track will open Friday, Saturday and Sunday at 08:00 in the morning. These times are subject to change.





### **CIRCUIT INFORMATON**

#### Food & Drinks

Mexico's culinary scene at the circuit surpasses many others, offering diverse and reasonably priced options. Indulge in a plethora of delicacies ranging from churros and donuts to tacos, pizza, and burgers.

Beer is served from 11:00 to 19:00, while liquor is available from 12:00 to 19:00. Bringing outside food and beverages is prohibited.

#### **Sanitary Facilities**

In general, there are plenty of restrooms on the track. Pay attention to the signs directing you to the nearest restroom.

#### Walking

Attending a Grand Prix usually entails a considerable amount of walking. It is essential to wear comfortable shoes that can withstand the walking demands, along with comfortable clothing.

### **Taking Pictures**

Photography is permitted; however, it is restricted to the use of simple cameras. It's important to be mindful of obstructing the view of fellow spectators. Everyone should ensure that their enjoyment does not disrupt others, so we encourage spectators to always be considerate of those around them.

### Clothing

Towards late October, Mexico can maintain considerable warmth, making cotton and linen attire advisable. Opt for T-shirts, shorts, or dresses for your track day ensemble.

#### Recommended to take to the track


- ID proof and entrance ticket;

#### Forbidden items

In case you are wondering whether something is allowed or not, please refer to the list below. All unauthorised items should be surrendered at the circuit's entrance gates. Circuit staff have the right to add other items to the list.

- Alcoholic drinks and drugs
- Aerosols (deodorant, mosquito repellent, etc.)
- Barbecues or (electric) cookers
- Cans, metal and glass bottles
- Dangerous objects
- Domestic animals
- Drones or similar equipment
- Fireworks, smoke bombs, rockets, laser pointers, stadium horns
- Flagpoles and parasols
- Food and drink
- Glass containers and/or objects
- Harmful and flammable substances
- Tents and sleeping bags
- Vehicles (bicycles, scooters, etc.)
