


LOSAIL CIRCUIT

Losail International Circuit, inaugurated in 2004, didn't host its inaugural Formula 1 race until 2021 due to the cancellation of the Australian Grand Prix. In 2022, the race was omitted here due to the World Cup. Among the current drivers, Pérez stands as the sole competitor who has previously raced at the Losail International Circuit. In 2009, the Mexican secured victory in one of the GP2 Asia Series races held here.

Primarily designated for MotoGP, the circuit spans 5,380 meters and boasts 16 corners: 10 right turns and six left turns. Notably, it features a long straight extending over a kilometer and a blend of slow and fast corners, with the long straight serving as the sole DRS zone.

In 2023, Max Verstappen secured his third Formula 1 world title here after the Sprint Race.





CIRCUIT INFORMATION

How To Get There?

At the circuit, there are designated parking areas for taxis and Uber. A taxi ride from West Bay in Doha to Lusail International Circuit typically takes about 25 minutes, costing around 35 Qatari rials (€9) without traffic.

Shuttle buses also operate regularly between Lusail Metro Station and Lusail International Circuit. A single trip on the metro costs 3 Qatari riyals (€0.80).

Please be aware that the journey from Lusail Metro Station to Lusail International Circuit may take up to 40 minutes. Additionally, note that on Fridays, the metro service begins at 14:00.

Sanitary Facilities

Generally, there are more than enough restrooms available along the track. Please pay close attention to the signs guiding you to the nearest restroom facilities.

Walking

Attending a Grand Prix usually entails a considerable amount of walking. It is essential to wear comfortable shoes that can withstand the walking demands, along with comfortable clothing.





CIRCUIT INFORMATION

Entrance

The main entrance and parking areas of Lusail Circuit are located behind the main grandstand. Information about the entrances and parking spaces has not yet been announced by the organisers, although a limited number of free parking spaces will be available at the circuit.

Food & Drinks

Various food and drink stalls can be found throughout the circuit. No alcohol will be served in the areas accessible to general ticket holders (except in the Hospitality Lounges). This means that the fan zones at the circuit and the various F&B areas will only serve non-alcoholic drinks.

It is forbidden to bring your own food and drinks to the circuit.

Taking Pictures

Photography is permitted; however, it is restricted to the use of simple cameras. It's important to be mindful of obstructing the view of fellow spectators. Everyone should ensure that their enjoyment does not disrupt others, so we encourage spectators to always be considerate of those around them.

Clothing

For the beginning of December, the weather in Qatar begins to transition. The average temperature usually drops, reaching around 25°C during the day and cooler temperatures in the evenings.

Men may find long trousers and shirts suitable for public outings, while women's attire commonly includes garments that cover the shoulders, upper arms, and knees, particularly in public settings.

Recommended to take to the track

- ID proof and entrance ticket;
- Sun protection;
- Sturdy walking shoes;
- Hearing protection;
- Photo camera incl. extra battery and memory card;
- Your printed ticket.

Forbidden items

In case you are wondering whether something is allowed or not, please refer to the list below. All unauthorised items should be surrendered at the circuit's entrance gates. Circuit staff have the right to add other items to the list.

- Aerosols (deodorant, mosquito repellent, etc.)
- Alcoholic drinks and drugs
- Barbecues or (electric) cookers
- Cans, metal and glass bottles
- Dangerous objects
- Domestic animals
- Drones or similar equipment
- Fireworks, smoke bombs, rockets, laser pointers, stadium horns
- Flagpoles and parasols
- Food and drink
- Glass containers and/or objects
- Harmful and flammable substances
- Tents and sleeping bags
- Vehicles (bicycles, scooters, etc.).
