ABOUT THE CIRCUIT



Silverstone Circuit, located in

Northamptonshire, UK, is a legendary racing circuit with a rich history dating back to 1947.

The circuit is best known for hosting the British Grand Prix, one of the most iconic races on the Formula 1 calendar.

With a length of 5.891 kilometers and 18 corners, Silverstone offers a challenging layout for drivers.

Speed is one of Silverstone's defining features. The long straights, such as Hangar Straight, where drivers reach speeds of up to 330 km/h, create spectacular overtaking opportunities.

In addition to speed, there is also spectacle. The technical sections of the circuit, such as Copse Corner and Becketts, challenge drivers to showcase their driving skills. The elevation changes and narrow sectors add extra excitement and challenges.



HOW DO I GET TO THE CIRCUIT?

There are various ways to travel to Silverstone Circuit for the F1 weekend:

By train

The nearest train station to Silverstone Circuit is Wolverton, about 16 km away. There are direct train connections to Wolverton from London Euston, Birmingham New Street, and Northampton. From Wolverton station, you can take a taxi or shuttle bus to the circuit.

By bus

<u>Megabus</u> also offers a convenient and comfortable travel option for F1 fans visiting Silverstone. With direct bus connections from 21 cities in England, you can travel to and from the circuit worry-free throughout the weekend.

ENTRANCE GATES

To ensure quick access:

- Have your bag ready for inspection.
- There may sometimes be a queue when checking all fans. We appreciate your patience.
- We advise you to arrive well in advance to allow sufficient time for the checks.

OPENING HOURS

The circuit is open from Thursday at 11:00 AM. On Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, the circuit opens at 7:30 AM.

The opening times for car parking are not known yet.





SANITARY FACILITIES

There are plenty of (temporary) toilets available at the circuit. Look for signs pointing you to the nearest toilet.

Generally, the toilets are well maintained. Especially just before a Formula 1 session, it can get very busy at the toilets during a Grand Prix weekend.



FOOD & DRINKS

There is a wide range of food and drink options available at the circuit. You can choose from pizza, traditional fish and chips, burgers, and Asian street food dishes. However, the prices are quite high; for example, you can easily pay £10 for a large slice of pizza.

You are allowed to bring your own food and drinks (including alcohol) for personal use. Alcohol must not be in glass bottles and is limited to a) 1 bottle of wine per person or b) 6 half-liter beers per person.



WALKING DISTANCE AT THE CIRCUIT

A Grand Prix weekend means a lot of walking. Therefore, wear comfortable shoes and clothing to prevent blisters and discomfort. Choose clothing that allows easy movement, and enjoy the event worry-free!



TAKING PHOTOS

It is permitted to take photos at the circuit with a simple camera for personal use. Be mindful of others and avoid obstructing their view. Be respectful to fellow spectators.







WEATHER & CLIMATE

During the British Grand Prix at Silverstone in July, you can expect the typical variable British weather.

Temperatures hover around 19°C with partly cloudy skies, perfect for a day in the stands. However, keep in mind that British weather can be unpredictable.

There is a definite chance of rain showers, especially in the afternoon and evening.



Visit the F1 Fan Zone at Silverstone Circuit. Here you will find interactive activities, merchandise stands, and food options. The Fan Zone is a bustling hub where fans can enjoy entertainment and experience a sense of connection with the world of Formula 1.



ENTERTAINMENT & ACTIVITIES

The Main Stage will host top artists throughout the weekend, including Stormzy, Pete Tong, and Rudimental. Kings of Leon will perform at the opening event on Thursday evening.



- Chairs and stools
