MARINA BAY STREET CIRCUIT

The Marina Bay Street Circuit winds its way through Singapore, featuring a combination of tight corners, fast straights, and challenging chicanes. Its tight and twisty layout demands extreme precision and skill from the drivers, putting their abilities to the test. With minimal margin for error, the races become even more intense.

Since its establishment, Marina Bay has consistently witnessed the presence of at least one safety car in each race edition, totaling 24 safety car deployments as of 2023.

What sets the Marina Bay Street Circuit apart is its lighting. Powerful lights illuminate the entire track, creating a surreal and dazzling spectacle against the night sky. This unique feature not only facilitates thrilling night racing but also offers a breathtaking backdrop of Singapore's iconic skyline.

How To Get There

The Marina Bay Street Circuit is within walking distance of most hotels in Singapore. However, you can also travel to the circuit by metro. The following stations are close to the various entrance gates.

- Entrance 1: Nicoll Highway/Lavender
- Entrance 2 & 9: Promenade
- Entrance 3A & 3B: City Hall/Esplanade
- Entrance 4, 5 & 6: Raffles Place
- Entrance 7: Esplanade
- Entrance 8: Bayfront

Opening Hours

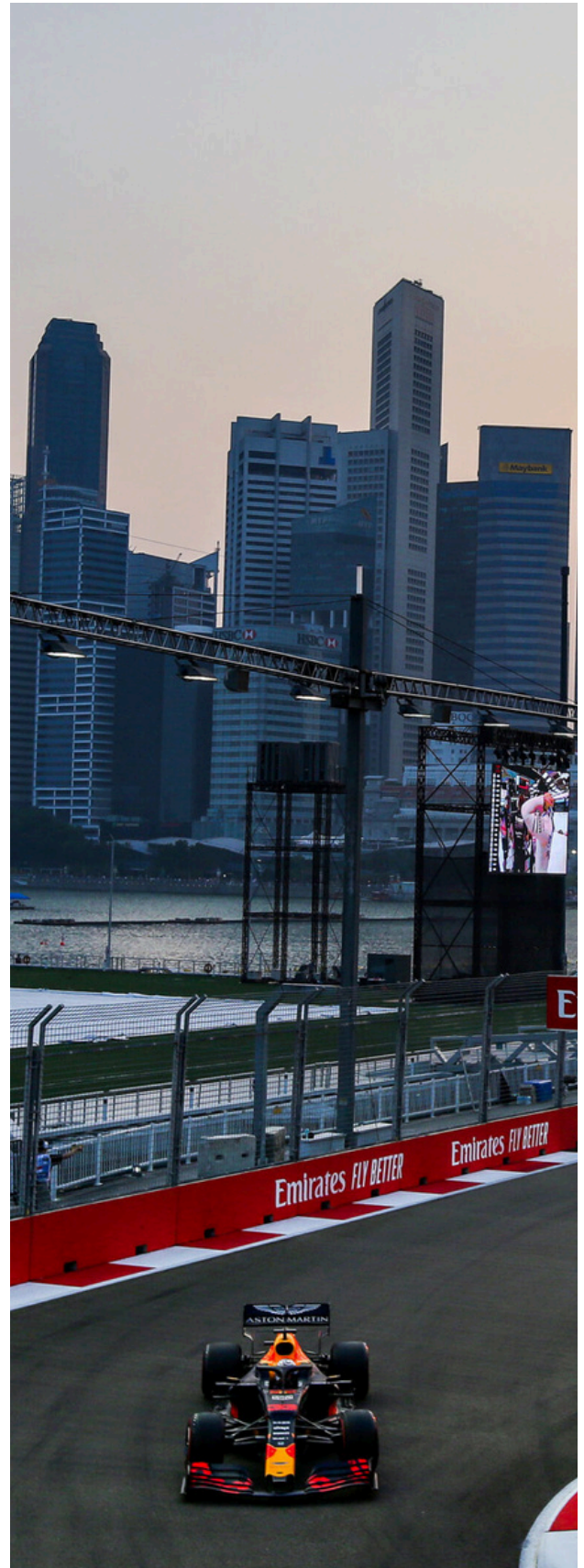
The circuit opens its doors at 2:30 p.m. daily and closes at 00:00.

Sanitary Facilities

Typically, there are numerous restroom facilities available along the track. Please be mindful of the signs indicating the nearest restroom locations.

Walking

Attending a Grand Prix usually entails a considerable amount of walking. It is essential to wear comfortable shoes that can withstand the walking demands, along with comfortable clothing.

Food and Drinks

Explore the rich diversity of Asian cuisine at one of the "hawker" centers, unique to Singapore, where you'll find a covered area bustling with various food stalls. However, be prepared for slightly higher prices for food and drinks at these centers. If you're looking for more budget-friendly options, consider grabbing a bite outside the circuit, where several affordable restaurants are situated.

Apart from a transparent bottle of water, limited to a maximum of 600 ml, outside food and drink are prohibited within the circuit premises.

Taking Pictures

Photography is permitted; however, it is restricted to the use of simple cameras. It's important to be mindful of obstructing the view of fellow spectators. Everyone should ensure that their enjoyment does not disrupt others, so we encourage spectators to always be considerate of those around them.

Clothing

In light of the tropical climate, it is advisable to wear breathable cotton or linen clothing during your trip to Singapore. Additionally, sunglasses, a hat or cap, and sunscreen are essential items to have on hand. The region experiences heavy rainfall, particularly during the day, so it's prudent to pack an extra shirt and carry an umbrella or poncho.

Despite the intense heat outdoors, air conditioning is prevalent in restaurants and shopping malls. Therefore, it is wise to bring along a sweater or vest for indoor comfort.

Recommended to take to the track

- ID proof and entrance ticket;
- Sun protection;
- Sturdy walking shoes;
- Hearing protection;
- Photo camera incl. extra battery and memory card;
- Your printed ticket.

Access Criteria

In case you are wondering whether something is allowed or not, please refer to the list below. All unauthorized items must be dropped off at the circuit entrance gates. Circuit staff have the right to add other items to the list.

- Aerosols (deodorant, mosquito repellent, etc.)
- Alcoholic beverages and drugs
- Barbecues or (electric) stoves
- Cans, metal and glass bottles
- Domestic animals
- Drones
- (Electronic) cigarettes
- Fireworks, smoke bombs, rockets, laser pointers, stadium horns
- Flagpoles and umbrellas
- Food and drink (except empty 600 ml water bottle)
- Glass containers and/or objects
- Hazardous objects
- Harmful and flammable substances
- Tents and sleeping bags
- Vehicles (bicycles, scooters, etc.)
