ABOUT THE CIRCUIT



The Spanish Grand Prix in Barcelona has taken place at the Circuit de Barcelona-Catalunya since 1991, serving as a rigorous challenge for both drivers and vehicles.

The track underwent modifications in 2023. The final chicane, comprising turns 14 and 15, was eliminated. The circuit spans 4,657 meters and features 14 corners. A total of 66 laps are completed.

The circuit features a lengthy straight, a combination of high and low-speed corners, and a bumpy road surface, making it particularly demanding on the tires. The drivers must maintain maximum concentration due to the constantly shifting wind direction.



HOW CAN I REACH THE CIRCUIT?

By Train

From Barcelona, there are two lines to Montmeló: R2 (from Castelledefels to Granollers Centre) and R2 (from Nord Aeroport to Macanet Massanes). Both require disembarking at Montmeló Station.

It is approximately a 45-minute walk from Montmeló train station to the Circuit de Barcelona-Catalunya. Keep in mind that the duration may be extended by the presence of crowds.

By Bus

From Barcelona, Sagales travels to the Circuit de Barcelona-Catalunya and returns to Barcelona as well. Departing from Estació del Nord, the bus will drop you off in front of the Sorli Discau supermarket close to the circuit, located approximately 300 meters before the main entrance.

By Cars

The Circuit de Barcelona-Catalunya is conveniently accessible from Barcelona via the C33 motorway or the C17 parallel road. While the C33 offers slightly quicker travel, it is advisable to consult a traffic application like Waze beforehand. It is important to be aware that significant traffic congestion may arise, particularly on Sundays. Additionally, parking at the circuit may involve considerable delays.



The circuit opens at 8:00 am on Friday, June 21. On Saturday, June 22, the circuit opens at 10:15 AM and on Sunday, race day, the doors open at 9:00 AM.



SANITARY FACILITIES

There are sufficient (temporary) toilets available on the circuit. Look out for signs directing you to the nearest toilet. In general, the toilets are kept very clean. The toilets can be very busy during a Grand Prix weekend, espeically right before a Formula 1 session.

WALKING DISTANCE ON CIRCUIT

During a Grand Prix weekend, expect plenty of walking. Hence, opt for comfortable shoes and attire to avoid blisters and discomfort. Pick clothing that allows easy movement, ensuring you can fully enjoy the event.

WEATHER AND CLIMATE

By the end of June, Barcelona enjoys a delightful Mediterranean climate. The sun shines brightly, with temperatures averaging around 28°C. Rainfall is minimal, occasionally manifesting as brief showers. Low humidity levels contribute to a comfortably warm ambiance.

TAKING PICTURES

It is allowed to take photos on the circuit with a simple camera for personal use. Pay attention to others and avoid obstructing their view. Be respectful to fellow spectators.





MERCHANDISE AT TRACK

Merchandise prices at the circuit are notably high. It is better to purchase merch from your preferred driver or team online beforehand. Alternatively, buying merchandise outside the circuit is also a viable option. Numerous tents offer Formula 1 apparel, caps, and other goods at more competitive prices compared to those at the track.

F1 FAN ZONE

The F1 Fan Zone at the Spain GP is situated behind the Main Granstand. It offers interactive activities, merchandise stands, and dining choices. This area serves as a lively center where fans can relish entertainment and immerse themselves in the realm of Formula 1.

BARCELONA FAN FESTIVAL

The Fan Festival in Barcelona is held at Placa Catalunya from June 15 to June 22. Visitors can explore F1 cars, pit box replicas, trophies, and simulators. On Wednesday, June 19, several F1 drivers will participate in a street race in Barcelona.

The official Formula 1 application provides fans with a plethora of information and features, including live timing, results, the latest news, and exclusive content, keeping fans informed about all the race weekend's activities. Download the application here.





FOOD & DRINKS

Visitors may bring their own food and beverages to the Circuit de Barcelona-Catalunya. However, please be aware that stainless steel bottles are prohibited. Plastic bottles are permitted.

Furthermore, numerous food trucks are scattered throughout the majority of the circuit, primarily located behind the Main Grandstand. The food you can buy is relatively simple, including items like burgers, sandwiches, pizza, hot dogs, and ice cream. Particularly during lunch hours, there may be a wait of up to 60 minutes before placing an order, thus it is advisable to consider this delay. While there are various individual dining tables available, they are frequently occupied.

Circuit de Barcelona-Catalunya is one of the few circuits where alcohol is prohibited. Outside the track, numerous tents offer beer, along with various food stalls.





If you are unsure about which items are allowed, please refer to the list below. Unauthorized items must be handed in at the circuit entrance gates. The circuit staff reserve the right to add other items to the list. Your cooperation is appreciated to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all visitors.




RECOMMENDED TO TAKE WITH YOU
