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So you might be planning to go to the Belgian Grand Prix and wonder which tickets you should get. Then this ticket tip guide might help. Here we will provide you with useful tips when selecting tickets for the Grand Prix.

Besides this there is a short overview per grandstand to give you an idea of what the views are with different ticket options. Good luck selecting your tickets. If there is anything you need help or support with, don't hesitate to reach out!







01. TICKET TIPS

To help you select the right tickets and get you well prepared for your trip to the Belgian Grand Prix, we have compiled a few ticket tips:

- Sunday tickets (one-day) are available for all grandstands and General Admission. During early bird sales, three-day tickets are often cheaper than Sunday tickets.
- Grandstand tickets for children (6-12 years) are roughly about 50% off regular three-day ticket prices.
- Grandstand seats are numbered for all three days (there is no "Free Friday" roaming option at Spa).
- A special grandstand for disabled fans is located next to the Gold 7 grandstand in La Source.
- All Gold and Silver grandstands offer views with a large TV screen. There are a handful of TV screens in the General Admission Areas, specifically on Kemmel Straight and Pouhon.
- The following grandstands have a cover and protect against the rain: Gold 1, Gold 2, Gold 3, Gold 6, Gold 7, Gold 8, Gold 9, Gold 10 and Silver 4.
- The following grandstands are not covered: Gold 4 and Silver 1-3 & 5.






02. GRANDSTAND TICKET TYPES

The best grandstand in our opinion in Spa is undoubtedly Gold 8. This grandstand lies on the outside of the La Source hairpin, with a view over the straight next to the pit lane.

If you've got your eye on this one be quick as it sells out early every year! Other good grandstand choices include Gold 3 and Fanzone Grandstand (uncovered) near the famed Eau Rouge.

Next to the VIP tickets, there are three main categories of tickets at the circuit. Gold, Silver, and Bronze. The gold tickets often provide the best views, however, they are also more expensive. The silver tickets are a bit more affordable while still giving decent views. Lastly, the bronze tickets at Spa are the general admission tickets.





GOLD GRANDSTANDS

Here you can find the different Gold Grandstand for the Belgian Grand Prix with information about the views you will have.

GOLD 1

Gold 1 is the main grandstand opposite the pit lane on the start-finish straight. It is a good choice for the start / finish of the race and action in the pit lane. However, it is advised to choose a different grandstand if you're looking for on-track action.

GOLD 2

Gold 2 is a big, raised grandstand. It sits on the straight between La Source and Eau Rouge. From here, you can see the old pit lane. This pit lane is still used for support races during the Belgian Grand Prix weekend.

You can see Eau Rouge in the distance, but there are better views available for this price.

FANZONE GRANDSTAND

The Fanzone Grandstand is the best spot to see Eau Rouge and Raidillion. It provides a great view of the famous corner and the track before it.

You do require a certain level of physical fitness to get to this grandstand from La Source, because it located on a rather steep hill. However we do recommend this stand as it offers great views.



GOLD 4

Gold 4 is an uncovered grandstand next to Eau Rouge. However, it is quite far from the track and at an odd angle, with limited views. Instead, you might want to pay a little more for Fanzone Grandstand as it will give you more value for your money.

GOLD 5

Gold 5 is located on the opposite of Gold 4 and is located next to the famous Eau Rouge. Since this stand is relatively far from the fan zone, Gold 4 might be a better option if you're looking to go here every now and then.

GOLD 6

Gold 6 is a small, covered grandstand on the chicane bus stop, close to the entrance to the pit lane. It is one of the most expensive grandstands, but you can always expect some action at this point of the track, so definitely worth it!

GOLD 7

You can find Gold 7 at the exit of the La Source (Turn 1) hairpin bend. The view cannot be compared to that of Gold 8. Is Gold 8 already sold out? Then it is better to choose one of the Eau Rouge grandstands rather than the gold 7 grand stands. Gold 7 has three grand stands. Gold 7 Ter, Gold 7 and Gold 7 Bis.

GOLD 8

Gold 8 is located on the La Source (turn 1) hairpin turn overlooking the start-finish straight. The popularity of this stand is evident from the fact that it is always the first to sell out! The views are great and if tickets are available, secure them while you still can!



GOLD 9

Gold 9 is a smaller, temporary grandstand closer to the opening corner La Source on the start-finish straight. It is located across from the slower teams' pit boxes. You can see La Source in the distance. This spot offers quite a good view of the action during the first lap of a race. Next to Gold 9 there is Gold 9 Bis. The difference is that from 9 Bis your view on turn 1 would be more limited, however, it is a bit cheaper.

GOLD 11

Gold 11 is situated close to the last corner of the Spa circuit and provides a splendid view of the main straight. A large TV screen is available for you to catch all the racing action. However, it's worth noting that Gold 11 is one of the pricier choices on the Spa circuit.

SILVER GRANDSTANDS

Here you can find the different Silver Grandstand for the Belgian Grand Prix with information about the views you will have.

SILVER 1

Silver 1 is located on the track between La Source and Eau Rouge. You still get an individually numbered seat in the Silver 1 grandstand, but in bleacher style. Furthermore, they do not have a backrest against which you can lean. Something to keep in mind is that the fence at the bottom of the grandstand does limit the view of the lower rows.



SILVER 3

Silver 3 is located near turn 10, Pouhon. The grandstand offers a view of a beautiful combination of turns. However, we do think it is a less spectacular grandstand than Silver 1.

SILVER 4

Silver 4 is located on the south side of the circuit, far from all other stands (plus far from the Fanzone). It overlooks the slow bend of Brussels (turn 8), but this is much better visible from the General Admission area on the inside of the bend.

Silver 4 does feature individual seats with backsupport (as in gold). However, he fencing at the bottom of the grandstand also limits the view of the lower rows

SILVER 5

Silver 5 is located at the exit of the Pouhon corner. From here, you can see the cars coming out of this corner before they enter Turn 13, Fagnes. The grandstand is situated next to Grandstand 6, which might offer a slightly more interesting view.

SILVER 6

Silver 6 is positioned by the Fagnes corner, this grandstand is near the Max Verstappen Grandstand. You'll enjoy an excellent view of turns 12 and 13, known for their high-speed nature. You can follow the racing action on a large TV screen, which means you won't have to miss any of the on the Spa circuit. Silver 6 stands out as one of the more affordable grandstands in Belgium.



SPEED CORNER

The Speed Corner grandstand is located between turn 9 and 10. Here, you can witness the cars building up speed from turn 9 towards Pouhon (turn 10). This grandstand is one of the most affordable options at the Spa circuit.

COMBES

Les Combes Grandstand is situated immediately after Turn 7, offering a view of the cars approaching Turn 8. This grandstand might have your preference if you're staying at one of the campings.

17-27 BLANCHIMONT GRANDSTAND

This Grandstand is open to visitors aged 17 to 27. It is located near Turn 14, just before Blanchimont, the long straight at the end of the circuit. The pricing for this Grandstand is among the most affordable options in Belgium.

BRONZE TICKETS (GENERAL ADMISSION)

Spa-Francorchamps has some of the best General Admission Areas of any current F1 circuit. Being the longest of the race tracks on the calendar, it is in the middle of the Ardennes.

You must be physically fit to some extent enjoy the beautiful natural surroundings. Many of the hiking trails are unpaved and for the best panoramic views you need to climb steep hills, especially around Eau Rouge. Wear comfortable shoes and if it will be raining, a pair of boots will be useful.

03. PARKING

PARKING FOR YOUR CAR

Are you travelling by car to Spa-Francorchamps? Then you can also book your parking tickets in advance at Race Experience. There are three parking tickets:

GREEN PARKING ZONE

The Green parking zone is located near the Silver 4 and Speed Corner stands. We do not recommend Zone Green for grandstands near the start-finish as the walk is a bit further. The Yellow parking zone would be a better choice for those.

YELLOW PARKING ZONE

We recommend the Yellow Parking Zone if you book a grandstand seat between the last corner and Eau Rouge.

RED PARKING ZONE

Choose the Red Parking Zone if you have tickets for the Max Verstappen grandstand. It is also reccommended to park in this zone if you have tickets for the General Admission Area near Blanchimont.

PARKING FOR YOUR MOTORCYCLE

Are you travelling by motorcycle? Then you can order parking tickets for the Blue Parking Zone. You can find this zone near the main entrance (start-finish).
