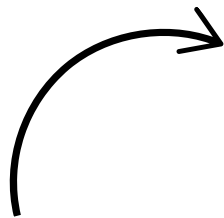

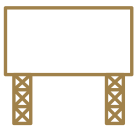
To help you select the right tickets and be prepared for your trip to the Grand Prix of Australia, we have a few ticket tips for you:



Are you ordering tickets for the same grandstand and the same day in a single purchase? Then you are guaranteed to sit together during the Formula 1 in Australia.



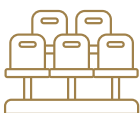
Child discounts are available for the age category 2–14 years. Please note: the discount is only valid if your child is 14 years old or younger at the time of the Australian Grand Prix. You can select the desired child tickets in the “Child Tickets 2–14 years” category.



Most of the grandstands on the circuit have access to at least one big screen. This ensures that you won't miss any of the action on track.



The view from the grandstands at Albert Park is generally limited to one or two corners. Some grandstands have an exclusive ‘premium’ section at the top. This section is covered and provides a better, panoramic view of the track. In addition, the roof offers some protection from the weather.

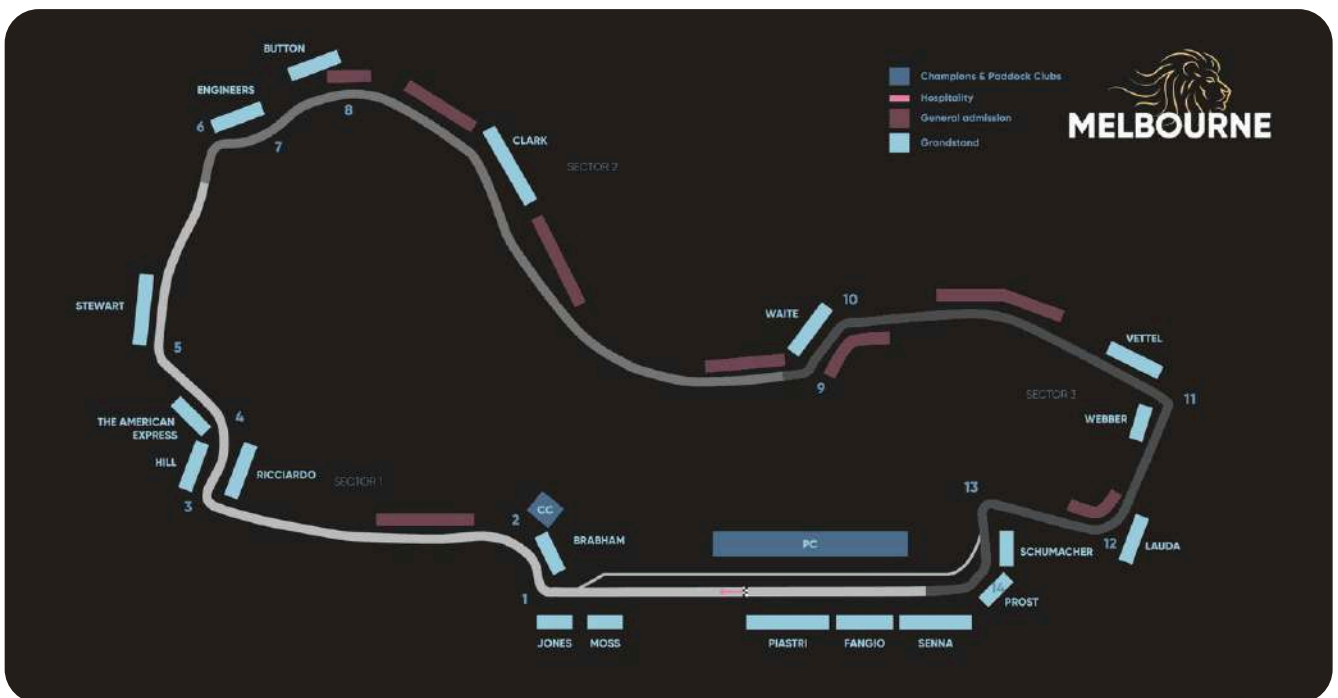


On Thursday, your ticket allows you to explore all the grandstands at Albert Park. This way, you can get a good idea of the views and unique perspectives that each grandstand offers.

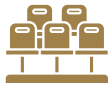


Grandstand Ticket Options

On the following pages, you will find an overview of the different grandstands available at the Albert Park circuit in Australia. For each grandstand, we provide information about the view and what parts of the circuit you can follow, so you can get a clear idea of what to expect and choose the option that suits you best.



CAIbert Park Circuit Australia



Grandstands

Fangio Grandstand

This grandstand is located along the straight section of the Melbourne circuit. From here, you can see the race build-up as well as the start of the race. You also get a great view of the pit lane, allowing you to follow all the teams' strategies live. This is one of the most expensive grandstands at the Australian circuit.

Piastri Grandstand

The Piastri Grandstand is a relatively new grandstand and named after the local hero, Oscar Piastri. It is located next to the Fangio Grandstand, at the start/finish straight. From this grandstand, you get a good view of the race build-up, the action in the pit lane, and the podium after the race.

When you purchase tickets for this grandstand, you also receive an Oscar Piastri merchandise pack. The grandstand offers both lower and upper seating. The upper seats are covered and provide a better view, but are therefore more expensive.

Moss Grandstand

This grandstand is located a little further along the straight compared to the Fangio Grandstand. From here, you can enjoy a fantastic view of turn 1, the main overtaking spot on the Melbourne circuit. You get a great view of the race start as the cars go through the first corner. Although this grandstand is not among the most expensive, there are cheaper options available. Nevertheless, it definitely offers good value for money.

Jones Grandstand

The Jones Grandstand is located next to the Moss Grandstand and is almost perfectly positioned at the apex of turn 1. This gives you a great view of turns 1 and 2, so you won't miss any of the action at the race start. This grandstand is on the more expensive side at the Melbourne circuit.

Brabham Grandstand

This grandstand is located opposite the Jones Grandstand and offers an impressive view of the first two turns. Compared to the Jones Grandstand, this grandstand provides a better view of turns 1 and 2. It is one of the most highly rated grandstands at the Melbourne circuit. Although it is among the more expensive options in Australia, it certainly justifies its price with what it has to offer.

Hill Grandstand

This grandstand is located at Turn 3, right after the second straight, making it a spot where many overtaking moves can take place. From this grandstand, you can enjoy a great view of Turn 3. Although it is not the most expensive option, it is also not among the cheapest.

American Express Grandstand

The American Express Grandstand is located on the outside at the exit of Turn 4. From this grandstand, you can watch the cars go through Turn 4 and head toward Turn 5, a slightly more technical section of the circuit.

Ricciardo Grandstand

The Ricciardo Grandstand is located at Turn 4. This is a slow right-hand corner just before the fast section after Turn 5. You have a great view of Turn 4 and a small part of Turn 5. This is one of the more expensive grandstands at the Melbourne circuit. We do not recommend this grandstand.

Stewart Grandstand

The Stewart Grandstand is located at the exit of Turn 5. Here, you see the cars pass by relatively quickly, but this corner usually doesn't produce much racing action. It is therefore not the most exciting grandstand option.

Button Grandstand

Located at Turn 8, the Button Grandstand offers views of Turns 6, 7, and 8. You will see the cars pass by quickly from Turn 8. This grandstand is one of the more affordable options at the Australian circuit, providing an excellent view without costing much.

Clark Grandstand

The Clark Grandstand is located between Turns 8 and 9. This grandstand sits along one of the fastest sections of the circuit. It's not a full straight, but not a real corner either. In the background, you can see the Melbourne skyline on the right and Albert Park Lake directly ahead. Overall, this grandstand is a good spot to watch the cars pass by at high speed, but actual overtaking rarely occurs here.

Waite Grandstand

This grandstand is located at Turn 10. This is the well-known high-speed chicane at the Australian circuit. You have a fantastic view of this combination of corners and the cars heading into Turn 11. It is one of the more affordable grandstands at the Australian circuit.

Vettel Grandstand

This grandstand is located at Turn 11. This is a spot where overtaking can occur. The grandstand is situated on the apex of Turn 11. It is one of the more affordable grandstands at the Australian circuit.

Webber Grandstand

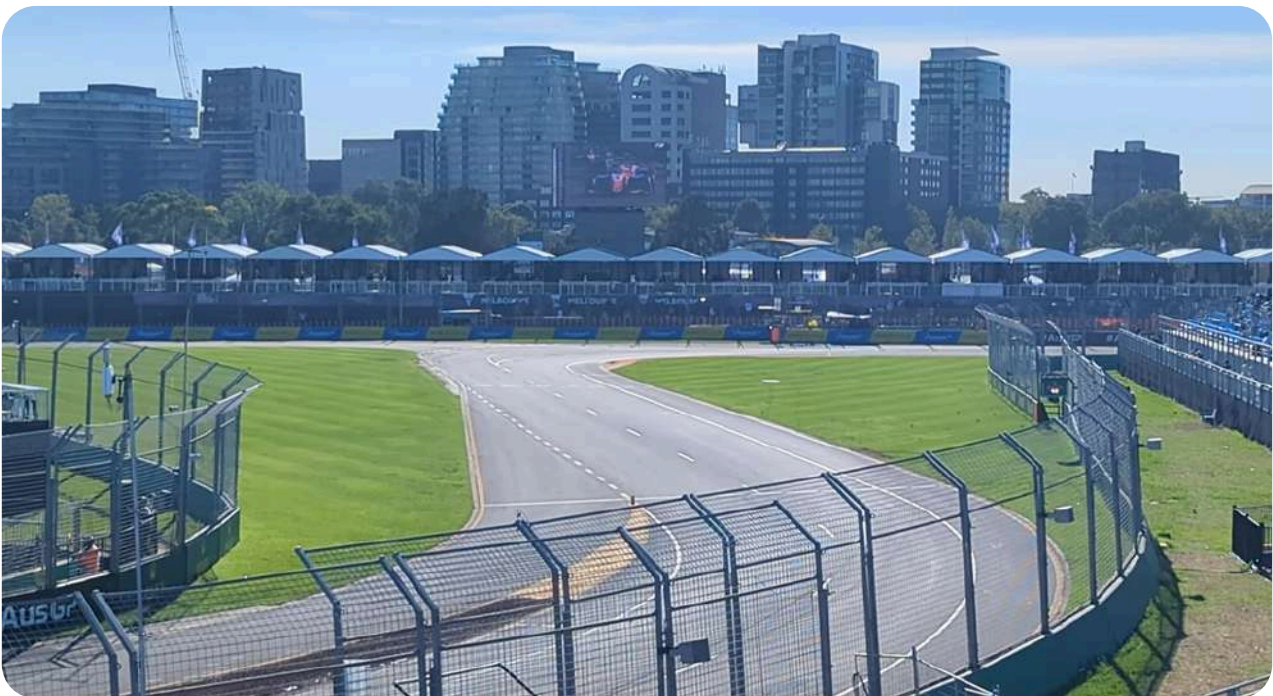
This grandstand is located at Turn 11. From here, you can see the cars as they go from Turn 11 to Turn 12. However, it is not the most impressive grandstand, and there are better options available for your money.

Lauda Grandstand

This grandstand is located at Turn 12. The Lauda Grandstand sits on the apex of Turn 12, giving you a great view of the corner. You also have a good view of the cars heading towards Turn 13. This grandstand is one of the more affordable options at the Melbourne circuit.

Schumacher Grandstand

This grandstand is located at Turns 14 and 15, the final corners of the Australian circuit. The Schumacher Grandstand is situated opposite the entrance to the pit lane. In terms of value for money, this is one of the best grandstands at the Melbourne circuit.

Prost Grandstand

This grandstand is located at Turn 14, the final corner of the Australian circuit. It is situated next to the Schumacher Grandstand, with the Prost Grandstand positioned slightly further along the last corner. This is one of the more expensive grandstands at the Melbourne circuit, but it is certainly worth the money.

Senna Grandstand

Finally, the Senna Grandstand is located next to the Prost Grandstand. From this grandstand, you get an excellent view of the pit lane, allowing you to follow strategies live. It is situated at the final part of Turn 14, and you also have a good view of the straight from here. However, it is one of the more expensive grandstands at the Melbourne circuit, and the Prost Grandstand is a better option.

General Admission

General admission at the Australian Grand Prix offers a flexible and budget-friendly way to experience the action at Albert Park. With grassy viewing areas spread across the circuit, fans can enjoy different perspectives of the track, including key spots such as Turn 3 for overtaking or Turn 11 for high speeds. The open layout of GA allows you to move between areas, but arriving early is essential to secure a good spot, especially on race day.

The atmosphere is lively and family-friendly, with large screens so fans can follow the race from anywhere. While the facilities are simpler than those of the grandstands, there are plenty of food stalls and entertainment zones nearby. General admission is ideal for fans who enjoy exploring the circuit and experiencing the vibrant energy of the event.
