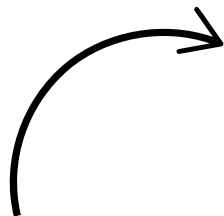

Grandstand ticket options

Are you planning to attend the Grand Prix of Canada and unsure which tickets suit you best? In this ticket guide, you will find practical tips to help you make the right choice. We briefly explain the differences between the ticket options and what to look out for.

Ticket Tips

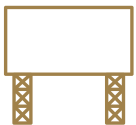
To help you select the right tickets and be prepared for your trip to the Grand Prix of Canada, we have a few ticket tips for you:



Are you ordering tickets for the same grandstand and the same day in a single purchase? Then you are guaranteed to sit together during the Formula 1 in Montreal.



Discounted tickets (around 50% off) are available for children aged 11 and under. They must be accompanied by an adult. Seniors aged 65 and over receive a discount on tickets for the Family Grandstand. On the same Family Grandstand, paying adults can bring their child aged 15 or under. The tickets are reasonably priced.



Most of the grandstands on the circuit have access to at least one big screen. This ensures that you won't miss any of the action on track.



The grandstands at Circuit Gilles Villeneuve are temporary structures. Be prepared for hard aluminum planks as seats, so bring a cushion for extra comfort. The only exception is the expensive Grandstand 1 seats opposite the pit lane, which have backrests.

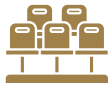


Grandstand Ticket Options

On the following pages, you will find an overview of the different grandstands available at the Circuit de Gilles Villeneuve in Canada. For each grandstand, we provide information about the view and what parts of the circuit you can follow, so you can get a clear idea of what to expect and choose the option that suits you best.

Grandstands

Grandstand 1

Grandstand 1 is located at the start/finish opposite the pit lane. These seats are a great choice for first-time visitors, as well as for anyone who wants to see the pit action, the race build-up, and the podium celebrations. If you are looking for on-track action, consider the grandstands at the Senna Curve. This grandstand is not covered.

Platine Grandstands

The Platine Grandstand is located at Turn 1, at the end of the main straight. From here, you can watch the race start as the cars storm into the first corner, providing plenty of action to enjoy. You can follow the cars along the straight and catch a glimpse of the first two corners. The excellent views make this grandstand a popular choice.

Senna Curve (Grandstands 10,11 & 12)

At the Senna Curve, there are three grandstands offering the best viewpoints on the circuit: Grandstands 10, 11, and 12. There is always plenty of on-track action at these corners, especially at the start of the race. Grandstand 12 is located in the middle of Turn 10, while Grandstands 10 and 11 are just after it. Some seats offer a view from the start grid all the way to Turn 3. These grandstands are not covered.

Grandstand 32

This grandstand is located at Turn 6. Here, you can see the cars slow down through this section, and almost every year something happens! In 2024, Albon and Sainz collided in this turn, and Pérez also had a crash here. In short, there is plenty to see!

Grandstand 33

Grandstand 33 is also known as the Family Grandstand. It is located between Turns 6 and 7. Although it is not in a prime location along the circuit, this grandstand offers significant benefits, especially if you have children under 15 and seniors (65+) in your group.

Grandstand 31

A popular choice! This grandstand at Turns 8 and 9 offers exciting action throughout the weekend. In 2023, an incident involving George Russell occurred here, adding extra drama. You also get a great view of the cars coming from Turn 7.

Grandstands rond de Hairpin (21, 15, 24 & 34)

These grandstands are located around the hairpin of the circuit (Turn 10). **Grandstand 24** is also known as the Lance Stroll Grandstand, named after the Canadian driver currently active in Formula 1. This grandstand, along with **Grandstand 15**, is the best choice around the hairpin. However, **Grandstands 21** and **34** are still good options.

Grandstand 46 & 47

If you are looking for more affordable grandstands, Grandstands 46 or 47 could be an option for you. They are located between Turns 11 and 12, after the hairpin and just before the second straight. Grandstand 47 is on the inside of the circuit, while Grandstand 46 is on the outside. However, keep in mind that these grandstands do not offer a view of the TV screens. Since they are only slightly more expensive than General Admission, they remain a good option. Both grandstands are not covered.

General Admission

General Admission tickets for the Canadian Grand Prix are affordable. Unfortunately, they do not offer the best viewing opportunities. The circuit is known for its long straights and slow corners. The existing grandstands occupy the best vantage points, which means you will need to find a spot between the grandstands (like sardines in a can) or watch the cars on the straight.

There is more space to move around in the general admission areas on Friday, the day before the weekend crowds arrive for qualifying and the race. There are decent viewing spots near some grandstands, so it's important to arrive early to secure a spot. Both sides of Grandstand 24 are elevated but fill up quickly. There is also space between and in front of Grandstands 11 and 12. The straight behind Grandstand 31 offers shade but, in return, does not have a view of a big screen.
