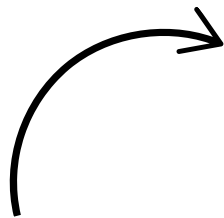

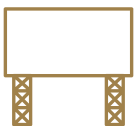
To help you select the right tickets and be prepared for your trip to the Austin Grand Prix, we have a few ticket tips for you:



Are you ordering tickets for the same grandstand and the same day in a single purchase? Then you are guaranteed to sit together during the Formula 1 in the United States.



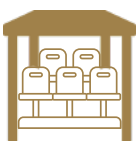
Children aged 3 or under can get a free General Admission ticket, provided they are accompanied by an adult with a ticket. Children aged 4 and older require a ticket, whether for General Admission or a reserved seat.



Most of the grandstands on the circuit have access to at least one big screen. This ensures that you won't miss any of the action on track.



There are four ticket categories available for this Grand Prix. You can choose from General Admission, Bleacher Grandstands, Premium Grandstands, or a Flex Pass.



Most grandstands are not covered. Only part of the Main Grandstand is, so be prepared for the weather.

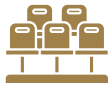


Grandstand Ticket Options

On the following pages, you will find an overview of the different grandstands available at the Circuit of the Americas in the United States. For each grandstand, we provide information about the view and what parts of the circuit you can follow, so you can get a clear idea of what to expect and choose the option that suits you best.



Circuit of the Americas (COTA)



Grandstands

Main Grandstand

The Main Grandstand is located along the start/finish straight of the circuit. You get an excellent view of the start/finish area, the race build-up, the pit lane, and the podium ceremony after the race.

Turn 1 Grandstand

The Turn 1 Grandstand is a popular choice, but it is relatively expensive due to its attractive features. This grandstand is located on top of a hill, giving you a fantastic panoramic view of the circuit. You can see both the long straight (start/finish) and the first corner. The significant elevation changes from the start/finish line to the first corner, combined with the cars slowing down through the blind corner, create spectacular and entertaining visuals.

Additionally, because the grandstand is on top of a hill, the higher you sit, the more of the other sections of the circuit you can see.

Turn 2 Grandstand

The Turn 2 Grandstand is located on the outside of the circuit at Turn 2, as the name suggests. You can see the cars coming out of Turn 1, still relatively close together after the start of the race, which can be exciting. However, for the rest of the race, there are grandstands with better views of the circuit.

Turn 4 Grandstand

From the Turn 4 Grandstand, you can see the Formula 1 cars racing through fast corners. They change direction multiple times at high speed, creating a visually impressive spectacle. The esses are inspired by the iconic Maggots, Becketts & Chapel section of the Silverstone circuit. This grandstand provides a nice side view of the corner combination.

Turn 6 Grandstand

The grandstand at Turn 6 is located on the inside of the circuit, also at the esses corner combination. However, it offers a very different perspective compared to the Turn 4 Grandstand. While Turn 4 provides a side view of the section, the Turn 6 Grandstand gives you a frontal view of the corners.

Turn 9 Grandstand

The grandstands at Turn 9 offer an excellent view of Turns 8, 9, and 10. You also get a clear view of a significant part of the straight. Despite being one of the more affordable options, these grandstands come highly recommended! They are located just before a sharp left-hand corner at the end of the back straight, between Turns 9 and 10.

Turn 12 Grandstand

The grandstand at Turn 12 (especially the upper rows) offers spectators an excellent view. You get a prime vantage point of the most strategic overtaking spots on the circuit at Turns 12, 13, 14, 15, and even a little of Turn 16. Here, you'll see Formula 1 cars slowing down as they navigate the tight corners, arriving at relatively low speeds, perfect for capturing impressive photos. Additionally, there's a chance to witness exciting overtaking maneuvers. Let's hope luck is on your side!

Turn 15 Grandstand

From the Turn 15 Grandstand, you can see the cars approaching from Turns 12 and 13 in the distance and get a good view of Turns 14 and 15 as they head toward Turn 16. You have a clear view of a technical section of the circuit and may even witness an overtaking attempt. It is one of the more expensive grandstands on the circuit, but it provides a great spot to watch the race.

Turn 19 Grandstand

The Turn 19 Grandstand is located between Turns 18 and 19. It offers spectators an exceptional view of the final corner combination (Turns 18, 19, and 20). The main advantage is the clear view of Turn 20 from the Turn 19 Grandstand. This one is affordably priced, especially compared to other grandstands at the Austin circuit.

General Admission

General Admission tickets for the Austin Grand Prix are an excellent option for budget-conscious fans. You don't get assigned seating, but you have the freedom to walk around the circuit and watch the action from different spots. Some good viewing areas are Turns 1, 11, and 17.

Turn 1 offers the best views. Being at a higher elevation gives you a great vantage point over the Austin circuit. There is also a large TV screen, so you won't miss any of the race. The only downside is that you need to arrive early to secure a good spot.

Turn 11 is less crowded than Turn 1. Here, you can watch the drivers navigate the hairpin. With a TV screen nearby, you won't miss any race action. The downside is that it is relatively far from the food stalls.

Turns 16 and 17 give you views of the cars going through those corners. From this spot, there is no TV screen, but a big advantage is that the food stalls are close by.
