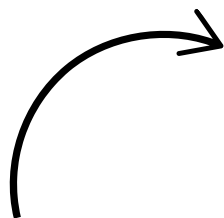

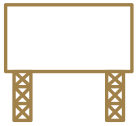

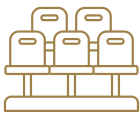
To help you select the right tickets and be prepared for your trip to the British Grand Prix of, we have a few ticket tips for you:



Are you ordering tickets for the same grandstand and the same day in a single purchase? Then you are guaranteed to sit together during the Formula 1 in Silverstone.



Most of the grandstands on the circuit have access to at least one big screen. This ensures that you won't miss any of the action on track.



All grandstands have numbered seats, which means you can move around freely during the race weekend without worrying about losing your seat.



At the circuit, there are several wheelchair-accessible platforms and viewing terraces available. These spots include the following corners: Copse, Woodcote, Luffield, the Wellington Straight, Stowe, and Abbey. There is also a circuit accessibility team on-site to provide assistance if needed.

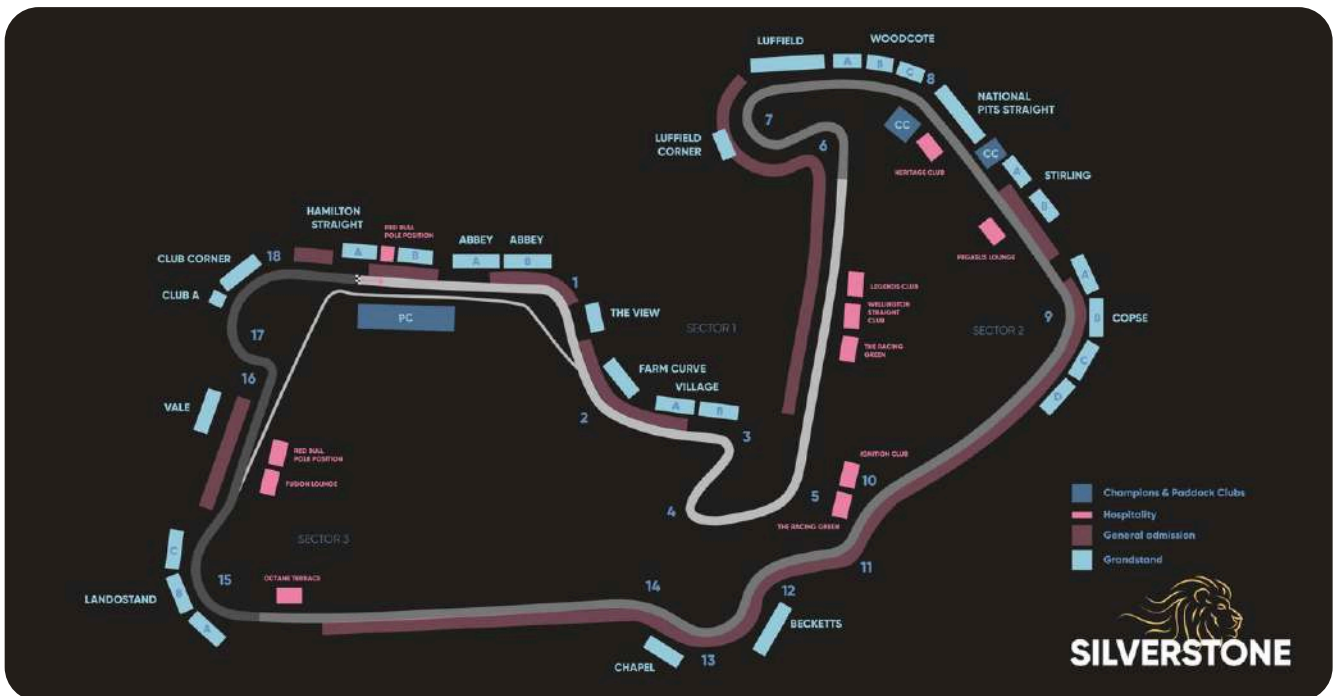


Your Formula 1 tickets give you access to all entertainment zones, the podiums, the F1 Fanzone, and the Silverstone Museum.

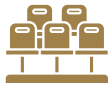


# Grandstand Ticket Options

On the following pages, you will find an overview of the different grandstands available at the Silverstone circuit in Great Britain. For each grandstand, we provide information about the view and what parts of the circuit you can follow, so you can get a clear idea of what to expect and choose the option that suits you best.

## Grandstands

### National Pit Straight Grandstand

The National Pit Straight Grandstand is located along the old start-finish straight, just after Woodcote Corner. This grandstand is covered, protecting you from the rain that England is known for. It is also slightly elevated, giving you a panoramic view from Luffield to Copse Corner. In addition, you overlook the paddock of the support series such as Formula 2 and Formula 3. All in all, it's a comfortable place to enjoy the racing spectacle.

### Stirling A / B Grandstand

From these grandstands, you can see the cars coming from Turn 8 and heading toward the fast Copse corner. Of the two, Stirling B offers a better view of Copse corner. Grandstand Stirling B is covered, while Stirling A is not.

### Club Corner and Club A Grandstand

The Club Corner Grandstand is located at the final corner of Silverstone. The corner leads onto the Hamilton Straight. It is a good and popular choice for Silverstone. There are four sections in this large grandstand. The best tickets are in Section 2, closest to the pit boxes. From here, you get excellent seats with a great view of the podium celebrations after the race.

## Abbey A & Abbey B

The Abbey Grandstands are located at the end of the Hamilton Straight, right next to the opening corner, Abbey. From these grandstands, you have a view of the main straight, the first corner, the pit stops, and the start/finish of the race. The grandstands are similar, but Abbey B offers a slightly better view of Turn 1. Abbey A is not covered, while Abbey B is covered.

## The View Grandstand

The View Grandstand offers an great view of the opening corners. You have a good view of the start of the race and the pit lane exit. It does vary slightly depending on which side of the grandstand you are seated. From the right side, you will see more of the race start than from the left. However, even from the left side, you still get a great view of the cars charging through the first corner after the start, when everything is still close together. The grandstand is not covered. Overall, this is an excellent grandstand at the Silverstone circuit.

## Farm Curve

Farm Curve is located between the View and Village grandstands, at Turn 2. From here, you get a fantastic view of Turns 2 and 3. This is one of the better grandstands at the Silverstone circuit. You can see the cars coming out of Turn 1, through the fast Turn 2, and then braking for Turn 3. The Farm Curve Grandstand is not covered.

## **Village A/B Grandstands**

The more expensive Village A/B Grandstands offer a close-up view of the tricky, slower corners. From these grandstands, you can easily walk to the Village podium, where concerts are held every evening during the Grand Prix weekend. The Village A/B Grandstands provide views of the drivers exiting the fast Turn 2 and braking hard for Turns 3 and 4. Village A is the cheaper of the two and is not covered. Village B is slightly closer to Turn 3 and is covered.

## **Luffield & Luffield Corner Grandstand**

The Luffield Corner Grandstand is located at Turn 7, the Luffield corner. From this grandstand, you can see the cars arriving from the Wellington Straight, coming out of Turn 6, and then navigating the slow Turn 7 toward the faster Turn 8.

The Luffield Grandstand is just after Turn 7. From this grandstand, you can still see the cars coming from Turn 6 and watch them accelerate toward Turn 8. Both grandstands are covered. Of the two, we would recommend the Luffield Grandstand.

## **Woodcote A/B/C Grandstand**

The Woodcote Grandstands are located at Turn 8. From these grandstands, you have a view of Turns 6 and 7. You can also see the cars navigate Turn 8 and head onto the National Pit Straight. Woodcote A is slightly closer to Turn 7, while Woodcote B & C offer a slightly better view of Turn 8 and the National Pit Straight. Both grandstands are covered.

## Copse A/B/C/D

The Copse Grandstand is located at Turn 9. This is one of the fastest corners on the Silverstone circuit. It's the famous corner where Lewis Hamilton collided with Max Verstappen in 2021. You get a fantastic view of this fast corner because you are positioned directly on the apex. There are four Copse Grandstands, Copse A, B, C, and D, located around the corner. Copse A, B, and C are covered, while Copse D is not.

## Chapel Grandstand

Chapel is the last grandstand in the technical corner complex “Maggotts and Becketts” and offers a great panoramic view of it. These very fast corners are well known on the Silverstone circuit. The Chapel Grandstand is located at Turn 14. Here you can see the cars coming straight toward you as they speed through Turns 12 and 13. This grandstand is not covered.

## Vale Grandstand

The Vale Grandstand is located at Turn 16. From this grandstand, you can see the cars exiting the fast Turn 15 and heading toward the Turn 16-18 complex. You also have a good view of the pit lane entry, allowing you to see who pits first. Over the years, this has also been a spot where several incidents have occurred. The grandstand is one of the cheapest at the Silverstone circuit but is not covered.

## Landostand

Another great grandstand, the Landostand, is located at Stowe Corner, one of the fastest corners at Silverstone. Drivers approach Stowe at speeds above 300 km/h from Hangar Straight, taking the corner in 4th or 5th gear. There are three grandstands that offer a view of this spectacular corner. These grandstands were previously known as Stowe A, B, and C, but from 2025 they will be called Landostand A, B, and C.

The large run-off areas near Stowe, with a long view of the circuit, are not a problem. In fact, they provide a fantastic panoramic view of the track. We recommend Landostand A and Landostand B. From these grandstands, you can follow the drivers as they go through Hangar Straight and Stowe, and then head toward Vale and the final corner complex of the circuit.

## Hamilton Straight A / B Grandstand

Hamilton Straight A is the main grandstand at the Silverstone circuit and is therefore also the most expensive. The grandstand is covered and primarily offers views of the last few corner complexes, the pit lane, and the pit boxes of the slower teams.

Hamilton B is not covered. Due to Red Bull hospitality, the view of the last few corners is limited. The grandstand is located directly at the start/finish line, providing a great view of the race start and Turn 1. In addition, you have a good view of the pit boxes of the top teams.

## Becketts Grandstand

The Becketts Grandstand is a covered grandstand. It is located opposite the unique Maggotts and Becketts corner complex. From this spot, you can see the cars speed through Maggotts and Becketts and how the drivers then continue onto Hangar Straight.

The Becketts corner complex is not the best place for overtaking. From this grandstand, in addition to Maggotts and Becketts, you also have a view of Turns 4 and 5. The Becketts Grandstand is covered.

## General Admission

Want to save on your Grand Prix trip to Silverstone? Then choose General Admission tickets.

The General Admission offering at Silverstone is quite extensive, which can somewhat justify the relatively high ticket price. The admission areas are located almost all around the circuit, providing excellent viewing points at some of the best corners. In many cases, these areas are situated directly in front of the grandstands.

In recent years, the organizers have invested heavily in the standing experience by increasing capacity, building viewing mounds, and moving fences — all to bring fans closer to the action.

Some of the best viewing areas in the General Admission zones at Silverstone are: the International Pits Straight, Stowe, Luffield, Becketts, Vale, and Copse Corner.

It's important to secure your favorite spot as early as possible, especially on Saturday and Sunday, as the popular areas fill up quickly.
